Pestotnik, a clinical pharmacist and medical informaticist, is a longtime advocate for the quality and safety of patient care, which led him to develop TheraDoc's real-time surveillance and expert clinical decision support technologies. He is internationally recognized for developing and implementing the United States' first comprehensive clinical decision support software for infection control, antimicrobial stewardship, and adverse drug event surveillance. Prior to TheraDoc, Pestotnik held various positions at LDS Hospital in Salt Lake City, most recently as a clinical pharmacist in the Clinical Epidemiology and Infectious Diseases Department. He also was director for the Drug Surveillance Program and consultant for Medical Informatics and Outcomes Research.

For eight years, Pestotnik was a clinical instructor and clinical assistant professor with the Department of Pharmacy Practice at the University of Utah College of Pharmacy. He frequently is a guest speaker and lecturer at medical conferences and prestigious institutions such as the University of Cincinnati Medical Center, Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University, and the Department of Critical Care Medicine at Johns Hopkins University. He has authored or co-authored more than 75 peer-reviewed papers regarding the use of information technologies to improve the quality and safety of healthcare in publications such as *Annals of Internal Medicine*, *The New England Journal of Medicine*, *JAMA*, and *Pharmacotherapy*. Pestotnik earned his pharmacy degree from the University of Utah College of Pharmacy and a master's degree in medical informatics from the University of Utah School of Medicine.
